

Boy Scout Training Roadmap

Each Scouting leadership position has a specific set of training courses designed to help you provide the best program for the youth you guide. To find which ones you should take look for your position in the left column of the table below. If you change positions in the future (for example, if you are now a Troop Committee Member and you become an Assistant Scoutmaster), you should refer to this chart to determine which new training you will need. Completing Leader Specific Training allows you to wear the “Trained” patch. Remember you must complete Youth Protection Training before you register in your leadership position, and then complete Orientation and Leader Specific Training for your position. Please consider participating in supplemental and advanced courses to continue developing as soon as possible after your Scouting and leadership skills, and to be a lifelong learner!
